

# **Open Records Information Provided By The Iowa Lottery In April 2018**

On April 2, NuPoint Funding LLC of Boca Raton, Fla., requested a list of annuity winners from Jan. 1, 2017, to present. That same day, the Iowa Lottery provided one email with the requested information. There was no charge for this request.

On April 3, J.G. Wentworth Co. of Radnor, Penn., requested a list of annuity winners from March 1, 2018, to present. That same day, the Iowa Lottery provided one email with the requested information. There was no charge for this request.

On April 5, Novation Settlement Solutions of West Palm Beach, Fla., requested a list of annuity winners from Feb. 20, 2018, to present. That same day, the Iowa Lottery provided one email with the requested information. There was no charge for this request.

On April 6, Mark Griffioen of Cedar Rapids requested a list of Iowa Lottery scratch-game prize winners of \$10,000 or more from January, February and March of 2018. That same day, the lottery provided one email with the requested information. There was no charge for this request.

On April 11, American Annuity Funding of Boca Raon, Fla., requested a list of annuity winners from 1992 to present. The next day, the Iowa Lottery provided one email with the requested information. There was no charge for this request.

On April 23, Seneca One of Bethesda, Md., requested a list of annuity winners from Jan. 1, 2017, to present. That same day, the Iowa Lottery provided one email with the requested information. There was no charge for this request.

On April 25, the Des Moines Register requested copies of reports generated by Senet, a company consulted by the Multi-State Lottery Association following Eddie Tipton's arrest. That same day, the Iowa Lottery confirmed for the Register that the report is confidential under a few different sections of Iowa Code, and that the report would not be released.

On April 26, the Des Moines Register requested Exhibits 10 and 11, which were filed under seal in the Dawson litigation. On April 30, the Iowa Lottery confirmed for the Register that both sealed exhibits are confidential under a few different sections of Iowa Code, and that the Iowa Attorney General's Office has advised that a court order would be necessary before documents covered by a protective order could be released by any party.
